Coaching is one method of supporting leaders during times of change and growth. Coaching is defined as “an ongoing intentional conversation that empowers a person or group to fully live our God’s calling” (Keith Webb, *The Coach Model for Christian Leaders*, 2014).

Therefore, the Congregational Vitality Team has trained coaches to assist congregations or pastors with their work. Coaching support is contracted at the rate of \$70 per hour. A 50% discount is available to congregations who have contributed to Our Church’s Wider Mission (OCWM).
