Elizabeth Dilley - In the changing ministry landscape, more and more churches are calling non-UCC clergy as their pastors. The UCC has some denominational agreements that facilitate this in many instances, and there are some core expectations for other situations. Come learn how to best welcome ecumenically authorized ministers into UCC service in ways that support the covenantal health of congregations and clergy. This training is helpful for judicatory staff, Committee on Ministry members, but ecumenically ordained clergy who seek to serve or are serving in UCC contexts may also find it useful.
