Level 2 Racial Justice Training will use the “Respect and Affirmation” section of Rev. DaVita McAllister’s TARASC spectrum to dive into systemic racism and areas of work that we need to pay attention to related to respect and affirmation for all people. These trainings are separated by a week as participants will be given a bit of “homework” between the trainings to prepare for a deeper conversation during the second day of training.
